Moving our Embassy in Israeli

News that our government will consider moving our Embassy in Israel from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem may seem of little consequence to most people in Ivanhoe but to those of us who have spent time in the Holy Land and have developed friendships with local Palestinian Christians and Muslims it is heartbreaking. What our Palestinian Christian brothers and sisters must be thinking of our nation at the moment doesn't bear thinking about.

For Government leaders to say that moving our Embassy to Jerusalem would not impact on its commitment to a two-state solution is ludicrous. The two-state solution and the so called peace process is not working and has been deliberately undermined. The reason for this is that Israel, supported by US policy, constantly undermines Palestinian hopes for autonomy by expanding settlements, forced removal of families from their homes and farms, and entrenching the illegal occupation of Palestine. To move the embassy is to reward this behaviour and signal an end to any genuine bipartisan commitment.

What makes this announcement even more tragic is that it is so obviously linked to the Wentworth by-election and the hope of gaining a few more Jewish votes. But while this may attract the support of the more extreme Zionists many moderate Jews who also long for a peaceful and just two state solution also oppose any foreign embassies moving to Jerusalem before the "final status" of Jerusalem is decided.

Even if after the Wentworth by-election the government buries this thought bubble the damage will have been done. This ploy for votes has ditched international law, UN resolutions, the advice of its own Foreign Affairs Department and one of the precious few bipartisan policies of our two major political parties. Our government must not be allowed to undermine 50 years of a clear international consensus that Israel cannot unilaterally claim sovereignty over the city that should be a shared capital. Palestinian lives and Palestinian sovereignty are not a political football to throw around when your polling is down.
